He served as senior advisor to Governor Arnold Schwarzenegger and director of the California Recovery Task Force (as well as senior health policy advisor and acting director of the Employment Development Department in prior years). Mr. Schultz also served in the Cabinet of former Governor Gray Davis, having been appointed and served as acting secretary and undersecretary for the Labor and Workforce Development Agency. Ellen R. Shaffer: Ellen Shaffer is the Co-Director of the EQUAL Health Network, an Assistant Clinical Professor at UCSF, and a member of the CPHA-North Governing Council. EQUAL sponsors groundbreaking online advocacy for health care reform among a national network including women, seniors, public health professionals and the faith community, and is a project of the Center for Policy Analysis. Dr. Shaffer writes and lectures extensively on access to health care, women's health, and globalization. She has been elected to the Boards of the American Public Health Association and the National Women's Health Network. She served as senior health policy advisor to U.S. Senator Paul Wellstone from 1992 to 1995, guiding work on national health care reform and managed care patients' rights. Sarah Muller: Sarah Muller is the director of health care policy and community development at Working Partnerships USA. Ms. Muller joined Working Partnerships USA in July, 2001. Her research has focused primarily on health care and economic development. Her work has included assisting in the creation of a statewide health care proposal under SB480, evaluating the effect of job quality on the health of working families, a comprehensive historical review of the San Jose Redevelopment Agency with an emphasis on job quality and health care coverage, and an analysis of the regional economy. She is currently working with health care experts in the county to

expand health coverage to low income working adults in small businesses.
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Chris Wilder : With eighteen years in the Bay Area's public benefits sector, Chris Wilder serves as the Executive Director of the Valley Medical Center Foundation. Kathleen retired from Applied Materials, Inc, a high tech firm in Silicon Valley, after twenty-five years working for the company.
